

LEARNING EXPERENCES

Numeracy-

Children, do you have any paper plates at home? If not, you can trace around something round and cut out circles to use. I would like you and Mum or Dad to make some paper plate puzzles. You need 5 paper plates or circles.

- I would like you to draw a line down the middle of each plate.
- Can you write number 1 on one side of a plate and draw a big dot on the other side?
- Can you write number 2 on one side of the plate and draw two big dots on the other side?
- You will need to do the same for 3, 4 and 5.
- You can also practice your cutting by cutting down the middle line, mixing up the pieces and putting them back together.

Literacy-

After you have read 'Where is the Green Sheep?', I would like you to make a green sheep. You will need some cardboard, some glue, a black texta and some green leaves from your garden.

- 1) Carefully draw a sheep shape onto the cardboard. Mum and Dad can help you.
- 2) Paste down some green leaves onto your sheep.
- 3) Give your sheep a face with a texta.
- 4) Hide your green sheep in your house and ask someone to find him!
